LEARNING STYLE TYPES















Visual ©

Visual learners retain information best by viewing images, symbols or incorporating colour into their study

Best Techniques: Mindmaps, flashcards, colour-coded notes, present information through charts and graphs, watch videos, display notes on sticky notes

Solitary

Solitary learners work best alone, without the distraction of a study buddy or group

Best Techniques: Testing yourself, reciting notes, journaling

Social 222

Social learners work best with a study buddy or in a group

Best Techniques: Jigsaw, teach a partner, swap notes, debate, presentations, vs quiz

Verbals

Verabl learners learn best with spoken or written words, acronyms, rhymes and rhythms

Best Techniques: Audiobooks, close eyes when listening to a video, recite information, make up rhyme or acronym, copying, repeating and rephrasing

Liging ical

Logical learners like structure, are good with numbers and statistics and find patterns in information

Best Techniques: Keep organised notes, use flowcharts, timelines or structured mindmaps, use categorisation or classification, set goals and rules for revision

Kinaesthetic X

Kinaesthetic learners learn by doing and completing practical work

Best Techniques: Flashcards, role-play, move while studying, make models, charts, pictures, etc., interactive documents, educational games, practical work
