- punctuation
- conciseness
- tone

# QuillBot

A free account gives you access to:

- Paraphraser
- Grammar Checker
- Summariser
- Citation Generator



Premium can add more detail to increase sentence length (useful for reaching a high wordcount!)

# Thesaurus.com

Provides synonyms, antonyms,  
and sentence examples

★ Good for adding depth to essays

# Dictionary.com

Provides definitions, examples  
and idioms

★ Good for analysing assignment  
questions

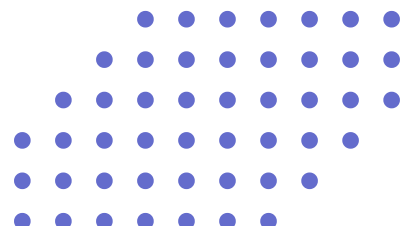
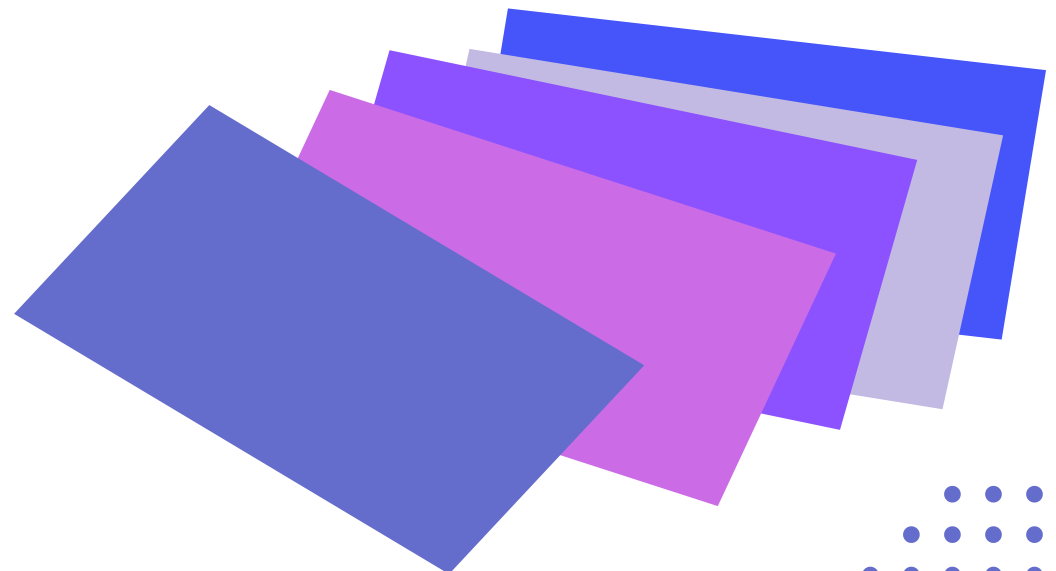

- Creates a bibliography that can be copied and pasted
- Free account saves up to 15 citations



- Google for academic literature
- Range of search parameters
- Provides citations in MLA, APA, Harvard, Chicago & Vancouver
- Exports to BibTeX EndNote RefMan RefWorks
- Can save articles to library
